- 1. On November 10th, at 7:30 PM, there was a session of the full body of Congress. Due to a clerical error, a bill was said to be passed, when it in fact failed.
- The bill in question, SCB-91-064, is entitled "A BILL TO SUBSEQUENTLY APPROPRIATE \$2,095.00 TO UNC-CH STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY"
- 3. With the bill having been passed, \$2,095.00 will be allocated to the Student Activities Funds Office account of the UNC-CH Students for a Democratic Society, pending the signature of the Student Body President.
- 4. Of the \$2,095, \$2000 would be used as an honorarium for an event to be held on Monday, November 16th, 2009.
- 5. There is a precedent for the issuance of temporary injunctions by the Chief Justice. Title III Section 410B states that "If, in the opinion of the Chief Justice, there is insufficient time to convene the court in order to issue a temporary injunction, he/she may issue a temporary injunction in the name of the Supreme Court."
- 6. Since the event would occur before a decision could be made by the Student Supreme Court, we respectfully ask that the Court enjoin Joe Levin-Manning from submitting the bill to the Student Body President or, if the bill has already been submitted, to enjoin the Student Body President from signing the bill until the Court can come to a decision.
