- 1. On February 9th, 2010 at 7:00 AM, polls opened for the student body-wide election. Students reported difficulties in voting, many being unable to enter the voting module in Student Central.
- 2. The Board of Elections failed to respond to the technical difficulties experienced by students and did not utilize powers granted in Section 511 of Title VI to extend the duration of the election in consultation with all affected candidates.
- 3. The Board of Elections allowed students to submit paper ballots, yet this decision was not announced to the student body, and, therefore, many disenfranchised students were not aware of this option and, therefore, did not cast a paper ballot.
- 4. Title III Section 410(A) provides that the Court or, when time will not permit convening the full court, the Chief Justice acting alone may issue an injunction against the Board of Elections to preserve the status quo until a determination can be reached
- 5. The plaintiff respectfully prays that the court will enjoin the Board of Elections from certifying the results from the Student Congress District 1 election, or alternatively to invalidate the results of said referendum until the court can properly determine a date for a re-election.
