With this Scheduling Order Specifying Procedures, the Court orders the following concerning the dates and procedures in this case. Counsels are ordered to be familiar with the Student Constitution, the Joint Code of Student Government, the Instrument of Student Judicial Governance, the Bylaws of the Student Supreme Court, and orders posted by this Court on the website at <https://tarheels.live/uncstudentsupremecourt/opinions/>. If there is a first appearance by any party after the date of this Order, counsel shall give a copy of this Order to that party.

1. Discovery. The Court sets a discovery cutoff on the date stated in the caption of this Order. The following discovery schedule shall apply.

a. Subpoenas. All subpoenas under Student Supreme Court Rule 38 shall occur on or before the discovery cutoff date. A subpoena requested on or before the discovery cutoff date may continue beyond the cutoff date, if necessary, for completion. All requests for evidence shall be served at least 24 hours before the discovery cutoff date. The Court will not

approve stipulations between counsel which permit discovery responses to be served after the cutoff date except in unusual circumstances and upon a showing of good cause.

b. Motions. A Justice assigned to this case shall hear all discovery motions. Discovery motions shall be filed and served as soon as possible and never later than 5 days after the discovery cutoff date.

2. Pretrial Conference. The Court sets a Pretrial Conference under R. 44 on the date stated in the caption of this Order. Pretrial Conference will take place virtually over Zoom, with the link to be sent by the Court before the conference but no later than 24 hours before.

a. Attendance. Only parties and their counsel may attend Pretrial Conference. Counsel attendance is required. Parties' attendance, while encouraged, is optional.

3. Motions. Absent exceptional circumstances, any motion to join another party or to amend a pleading, notwithstanding the Court's prior orders, shall be filed and served within 4 days after the date of this Order. Motions for Summary Judgment or Partial Summary Judgment shall be filed and served within 5 days but not less than 1 day before the Pretrial Conference unless otherwise allowed by the Court.

4. Trial. The Court sets a trial date on the date stated in the caption of this Order. The following procedures shall apply.

a. Location and Time. Trial will convene in the Kenan Courtroom in the University of North Carolina School of Law, 160 Ridge Road, CB #3380 Chapel Hill, North Carolina 27599. Trial times are 8:00 AM through 5:00 PM. Trial is open to all members of the student body at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

b. Exhibits. Unless the Court approves an alternative, counsel shall prepare an electronic version of trial exhibits in a single PDF, prefaced with an index of each exhibit, and filed with the Court no later than the morning of trial.

c. Witnesses. Counsels will provide the Court and opposing counsel a copy of their witness list by the day before trial. Counsel must keep opposing counsel informed about the order of witnesses. Only one counselor per party shall examine and defend a witness.

d. Admission of Exhibits. When counsel thinks an exhibit is admissible and should be admitted to the record, counsel should move its admission.

e. Objections. Objections should be brief, stating only “Objection” followed by the specific ground, such as “Hearsay” or “Relevance.”

f. Decorum. Trials will be conducted in a dignified manner, following the traditional rules of trial decorum. Show respect for the trial process, your fellow cohorts, and Court personnel by being on time. Address witnesses by the conventional titles such as Mr. or Mrs. or the same chosen by the witness. Address witnesses by their titles, professional or otherwise, such as Doctor. Do not address witnesses by their first name unless asked and the witness gives their consent. Most examinations and arguments should be done at the lectern. The Court recognizes that, at times, it may be necessary to conduct in camera review.

g. Modifications. The Court may modify this Order upon party motion or take it upon itself and shall be noticed to all parties. The Court recognizes exigencies and may re-schedule trial later upon showing extraordinary cause.
